Daly Surges through Field after questionable Penalty to Finish on Podium



Millville, N.J., June 26, 2010 - Race one at New Jersey Motorsports Park was an action-packed, dramatic 29-lap event. Conor Daly started today's race from the pole position for the fourth time this season and had a great start, maintaining his lead over the rest of the field. Though all looked promising for the 18-year-old to win his fifth race in the row-what would be a new record for most consecutive races won in the history of the Star Mazda Championship presented by Goodyear-officials issued a penalty to Daly along with Frenchman Tristan Vautier for jumping the start of the race, a penalty that was later deemed to have been "questionable" at best because Daly had complied exactly to the rule book. In an exciting and spectacular run, Daly surged ahead through the field, passing cars up until the final lap, to finish on the podium in third place, setting fastest lap of the race along the way..

"It was a tough call at the start," said Daly. "Unfortunately, when a driver wins four races in a row, it makes people scrutinize them a little more than usual. I had to battle my way back to the front, but I knew the car was fast because the Juncos Racing team has been doing an excellent job every race. After being sent to the back, I just focused on getting points for the driver's championship"
